## COP10 Nagoya

193 Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity adopted a new 10 year Strategic Plan and Aichi Biodiversity Targets to guide international and national efforts to safeguard biodiversity.

## SUSTAINABLE OCEAN INITIATIVE (SOI)

SOI was established at COP10 Nagoya. SOI's mission is to provide a global platform to build partnerships and enhance capacity to achieve the Aichi Biodiversity Targets related to marine and coastal biodiversity in a holistic manner.

## COP11 Hyderabad

Re-affirmation of commitment to Aichi Biodiversity Targets 6,10,11.  
TARGET 6: addresses sustainable fisheries  
TARGET 10: addresses multiple anthropogenic pressures on corals reefs impacted by climate change and ocean acidification  
TARGET 11: addresses marine protected areas with target of 10% of coastal and marine areas by 2020
